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

- Standardised and digitised EHCPs




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A single system with a common vision

Challenges

Amongst pupils with an EHCP, the most common primary type of SEN is Autism Spectrum Condition which accounts for 30% - Impact on health services including diagnostic and post diagnostic support

Amongst pupils on SEN support in state funded primary schools the most common type of need in 2021 was SLCN 34% and in Secondary schools this was Social Emotional and mental health (SEMH) 22%
