NATIONAL CARE LEAVERS WEEK





Local Authorities, the GLA and organisations that support Care Leavers put on events between 25th October to 1st November to raise awareness and celebrate our care experienced communities.

Jacqui McShannon, Director of Children's Services LBHF and ALDCS strategic lead on care leaving commented:

'On behalf of the London Care Leavers Trust Board ,we would like to take the opportunity in National Care Leavers week to recognise and celebrate the diverse talents and achievements of the capital's care experienced young people. We have come together as a dynamic partnership of young people, boroughs, health, business, the voluntary sector and the GLA to build consistent and wide reaching support offers for London's care experienced community. We've made some great progress, but as the national Care Review notes, 'The disadvantage faced by our care experienced community should be the civil rights issue of our time' - there is so much more we can do together. We are determined to make a difference.'

There was too much activity to capture everything here, but we'd flag the national Care Leavers Wanted campaign by the Care Leavers Covenant to connect Care Leavers with 1000's of businesses. The campaign was visible across many London boroughs and events, including this partnership with the London Borough of Lambeth to light up the London Eye in the Covenant colours and celebrate with young people.



We'll take this opportunity to share the <u>Covenant's Inclusive Employment</u> toolkit, which can help businesses and other organisations who are wanting to support care-experienced people.

ENSURING CARE LEAVERS CAN VOTE





Following changes to voting legislation, it is especially important that we ensure Care Leavers are able to have their vote counted and voice heard. Partnership for Young London (PYL), with support from the GLA, are running workshops across London for young people and to raise awareness amongst the organisations that support them.

Please sign your borough up to make sure young people can exercise their right to vote. We are very keen to visit at least 10–15 Boroughs across London to engage young people to sign up to vote. PAN LONDON CARE LEAVERS COMPACT UPDATE

The Pan London Care Leavers Compact is an umbrella for a series of partner agreements to bring consistency, breadth and quality to the support offered to London's Care Leavers. We are looking to launch the first version of the Compact in February '24, although several of these offers are already available to Care Leavers. Recent updates on this work include:

TFL Travel Discount – The Mayor of London announced on **9th October** the TFL travel discount for Care Leavers. We anticipate this will be live early next year. **Please click here to find out more**.

Health – ICS health partners are working to develop offers on eye care and dentistry to go with their work to exempt Care leavers from prescription charges.



Housing - Local Authorities are developing housing offers as well as closer relationships with the Care Leaver Covenant.

MEETING THE DEPUTY MAYOR!

The London Children in Care Council, care-experienced young people, and DCS leads met with Joanne McCartney, Deputy Mayor and members of the GLA Children and Young Londoners team on September 21st.

A range of areas were discussed, including a request to extend the TfL concession and review GLA activities against Care Leaver needs. All present were keen to work together on developing a more ambitious support programme.

The Department for Education have provided further funding support to develop regional plans to meet **Care Leavers Health, Housing, Education, Training and Employment, and Relationship** needs. We also want to ensure that across these areas we are meeting the specific needs of former Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Children, who represent approximately 35% of London's care leaving population. We are currently consulting with experts and those already active in these areas and welcome contributions and offers to get involved!
